THE FUND

The Fund has been managed since launch in November 2006 by James Inglis-Jones, and he was joined by Samantha Gleave in 2012. The Fund aims to deliver a total return, after all fees and charges, above the MSCI Europe Excluding UK Index plus 1% over the long term (rolling five year periods), by using the Cashflow Solution process to identify and invest in equities incorporated, domiciled, listed or which conduct significant business in the EEA (European Economic Area) and Switzerland, but excludes shares listed in the UK. There is no guarantee that the objective will be achieved over any period.

1. The MSCI Europe Excluding UK Net Return (GBP) Index plus a 1% hurdle on an annual basis became the new Target Benchmark on 13 March 2026, replacing the comparator benchmark MSCI Europe Excluding UK Index.

A hurdle rate is the minimum annual rate of return a fund must achieve before the manager can collect performance fees. A 1% hurdle rate means there is a minimum return of 1% above the return of the performance benchmark that must be achieved before a performance fee can be charged.

^{^^}Historic Yield: This calculates the income distributions made by the fund over the past 12 months as a percentage of fund value or unit price.

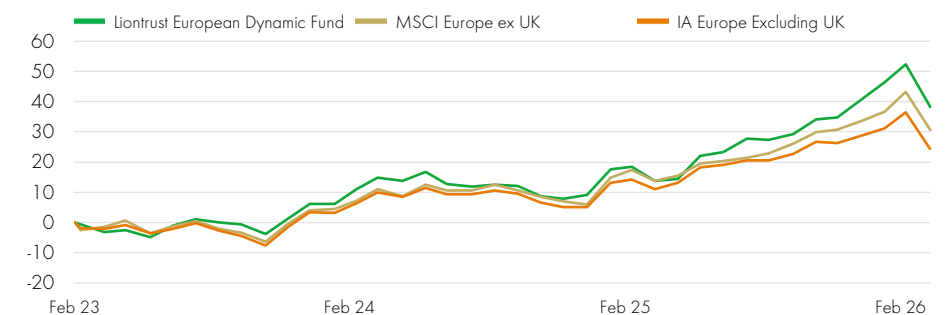

*The Ongoing Charges Figure (OCF) covers all aspects of operating a fund during the course of its financial year. These include the annual charge for managing the fund, administration and independent oversight functions, such as trustee, depository, custody, legal and audit fees and the ongoing costs of underlying investments including open and closed ended collective investment schemes. The OCF excludes portfolio transaction costs except for an entry/exit charge paid by the Fund when buying or selling units in another fund. This will have an impact on the realisable value of the investment, particularly in the short term. **These are the annual costs of running and managing the Fund.

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



- The Fund is categorised 6 for its exposure to Developed European (ex UK) equities.
