Objectives and Investment Policy

Investment objective

The investment objective of the Fund is to provide capital growth equivalent to that gained from investment in the world's equity markets. Income will not be a consideration.

Investment policy

The Fund endeavours to replicate the performance of world equity markets by tracking the MSCI World Index (the "Index") in U.S. Dollars (unhedged) with income reinvested through direct or indirect investment in the same or similar investments as the Index.

The Fund is passively managed and operates an index tracking strategy that seeks to match the Fund's investments with the Index constituents on an optimisation basis through investment directly in assets that are Index constituents (i.e. a physical replication model).

The Fund may also invest indirectly in such securities through quoted investment vehicles, such as Exchange Traded Funds, and holdings in other UCITS funds.

The Fund may also invest up to 20% of the Net Asset Value of the Fund in units and/or debt securities issued by the same body in order to replicate the Index.

Investment in the Fund should not be considered to provide a direct exposure to the Index. In normal market conditions the Fund can be

expected to closely match the performance of the Index, however, since the Fund does not seek to fully replicate the Index, an ex-ante tracking error of up to 100 bps should be anticipated due to the Fund's optimisation approach and small weighting differences that will necessarily result due to constituent allocation and security selection.

The Index is designed to measure the performance of the large and mid-cap segments across 23 Developed Markets (DM) countries. With 1,516 constituents, the Index covers approximately 85% of the free float-adjusted market capitalisation in each country.

You can buy or sell your shares in the Fund any day (except Saturday or Sunday) that banks are open in Dublin.

Unitholders may elect in the Application Form to have their pro rata portion of Gross Income (if any) reinvested in the Fund or to receive Gross Income payments instead. Gross Income payments are made at the discretion of the Manager (following consultation with the Investment Manager) provided that Gross Income payments are made to all Unitholders (whether or not an election has been made for reinvestment) on at least a yearly basis in accordance with the provisions of the Prospectus.

Recommendation: The Fund is suitable for investors with a time horizon of 5 years.

Why is this Fund in category 6?

The Fund is rated 6 due to the nature of its investments which include the risks listed below. These factors may impact the value of the Fund's investments or expose the Fund to losses.

The use of sampling and optimisation techniques and indirect investment through other CIS and investment vehicles to replicate the performance of world equity markets may cause the Fund to incur a tracking error relative to the Index which is greater than that which would be incurred if the Fund were to hold all of the securities comprised in the Index directly.

The price of shares and the income from them may fall as well as rise and you may not get back the amount you have invested. Investment in securities of certain companies may be less liquid, more volatile and subject to greater risks than securities of other companies.

It may be difficult for the Fund in extreme market condition to redeem its shares from ETF and CIS at short notice without suffering a loss. Investing in ETF and CIS may lead to payment by the Fund of additional fees and expenses in relation to those exchange traded funds. Investing in international companies means that currency exchange rate fluctuations will have an impact on the Fund.

The ability to trade REITS may be more limited than other stocks.

What do these numbers mean?

They rate how a fund might behave and how much risk there is to your capital. Generally, the chance to make large gains means a risk of suffering large losses.

A **Category 1** fund is not a risk-free investment - the risk of losing your money is small, but the chance of making gains is also limited. With a **Category 7** fund, the risk of losing your money is high but there is also a chance of making higher gains. The seven-category scale is complex (for example, 2 is not twice as risky as 1).

More about this rating:

This rating system is based on the average fluctuations of the prices of funds over the past 5 years - that is, by how much the value of their assets taken together has moved up and down. Historical data, such as is used in calculating the synthetic risk indicator, may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund.

These charges are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and selling. Overall, they reduce the growth of your investment.

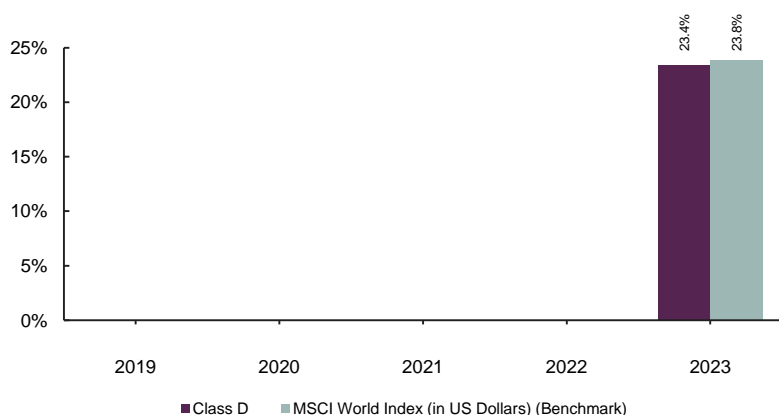
