Objectives and Investment Policy

Objectives

The investment objective of the Anchor Global Stable Fund (the Fund) is to achieve maximum long term return with diversification of risk.

Investment policy

The Fund is actively managed and will target returns in excess of inflation in developed economies. The Fund's investments will not be limited to any specific country, region, currency, industry or capitalisation focus.

The Fund may invest directly or indirectly in equities in companies primarily operating in countries with the most significant contribution to global GDP. The Fund can also invest directly in deposits held by credit institutions, fixed income securities, bonds, debt related securities and liquid assets such as cash and cash equivalents.

The Fund may gain limited exposure to securities or companies listed or traded in emerging markets up to 20% of its Net Asset Value.

The Fund may also invest in Real Estate Investment Trusts to gain exposure to property and also invest directly or indirectly to other collective investment schemes including exchange traded funds.

The Fund may use financial derivative instruments (FDI) in the form of futures, forwards, options, swaps and contracts for difference. FDI may be used for investment, efficient portfolio management or hedging purposes and to gain exposure to eligible commodity indices. FDI are financial instruments the value of which is linked to the expected future price movements on underlying assets.

The Fund may measure its performance relative to a benchmark index (Average G7 Country Inflation +1.5% p.a) for reference or investor communication purposes, including in the Company's annual and half-yearly reports. However the performance of the Fund relative to the benchmark index is not factored in any way into the investment process.

The Fund does not declare a dividend and therefore your shares do not pay you income.

You can buy or sell your shares in the Fund any day (except Saturday or Sunday) that banks are open in Dublin.

Why is this Fund in category 4?

The Fund is rated 4 due to its exposure to shares and stocks, and the nature of its investments which include the risks listed below.

The price of shares and the income from them may fall as well as rise and investors may not get back the amount they have invested.

Investing in international companies means that currency exchange rate fluctuations will have an impact on the Fund.

The Fund may invest in securities which may be difficult or impossible to sell at the time and the price that the seller would like which could have a negative effect on the Fund's management or performance.

It may be difficult for the Fund in extreme market conditions to redeem its shares from a CIS at short notice without suffering a loss.

Investing in a CIS may lead to payment by the Fund of additional fees and expenses in relation to those CIS.

The Fund may invest in companies based in emerging markets and may involve additional risks not typically associated with other more established markets such as increased risk of social,

economic and political uncertainty.

Through its use of FDI, the Fund may be indirectly exposed to physical commodities which can be extremely volatile.

As the investments of the Fund are in various currencies and the Fund is denominated in USD your shares may be subject to currency risk.

What do these numbers mean?

They rate how a fund might behave and how much risk there is to your capital. Generally, the chance to make large gains means a risk of suffering large losses.

A **Category 1** fund is not a risk-free investment - the risk of losing your money is small, but the chance of making gains is also limited. With a **Category 7** fund, the risk of losing your money is high but there is also a chance of making higher gains. The seven-category scale is complex (for example, 2 is not twice as risky as 1).

More about this rating:

This rating system is based on the average fluctuations of the prices of funds over the past 5 years - that is, by how much the value of their assets taken together has moved up and down. Historical data, such as is used in calculating the synthetic risk indicator, may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund.

These charges are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and selling. Overall, they reduce the growth of your investment.

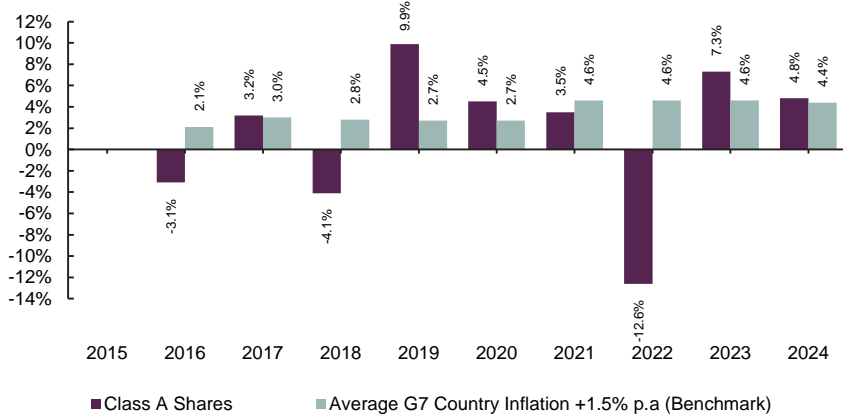
