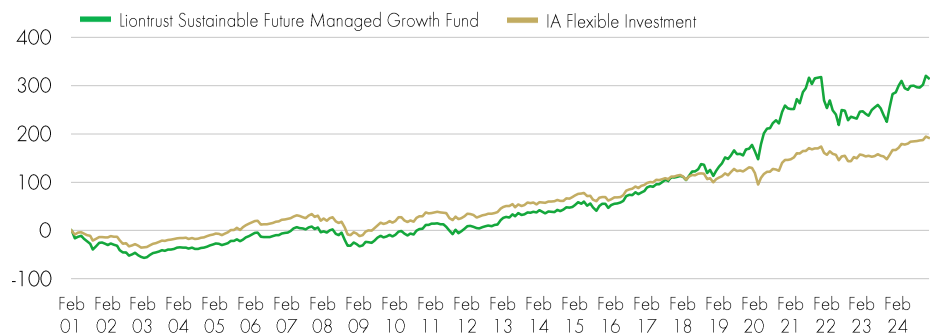

RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



- The Fund is categorised 6 primarily for its exposure to a diversified portfolio of Global equities and bonds.
